Environmental Corporate Responsibility



Eco-School

Haileybury Astana is deeply committed to sustainability and environmental education, which has resulted in the initiation of numerous eco-projects throughout the school and its community. One notable achievement is the production of a film titled <u>"Plastic IS Fantastic</u>" by the Junior Eco Team and the marketing department.

This film emerged as the winner of the COBIS Eco Film Awards competition. The short film celebrates the children's dedication to creating a sustainable future and showcases innovative approaches to recycling and reusing materials.

Tree Planting Campaign

The year 2022 was marked by a multitude of activities aimed at promoting environmental consciousness and highlighting the significance of sustainability. One notable event was the <u>Christmas Charity Event</u> organized by the Haileybury Parents' Association, which successfully raised 1,214,650 tenge.

Air Pollution Assembly

Haileybury Astana maintains an open approach to collaboration with NGOs and actively seeks partnerships with companies that prioritize sustainable development. In line with this commitment, Darina Akhmetova, a representative from AirVision company, delivered a compelling speech on air pollution in Astana. This presentation provided an opportunity for Senior School pupils to deepen their understanding of the local pollution situation. Additionally, the students were invited to actively participate in a sustainable fair, further encouraging their engagement in sustainable practices.

Food Sustainability Talk with IB students

We were privileged to have esteemed guests at Haileybury Astana, including Her Excellency Kathy Leach, the UK Madam Ambassador; His Excellency Marco Alberti, Ambassador of Italy; Ms Sara Roversi, founder and Chairwoman of the Future Food Institute; and Her Excellency Manal al-Sayed Yahya al-Shinnaw, Ambassador of Egypt. In a special meeting, these distinguished individuals engaged in a discussion with our IB students on the crucial topic of <u>food sustainability and regenerative</u> agriculture.

The conversation focused on aligning these practices with the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) outlined in the 2030 UN Agenda on Sustainable Development. This enlightening dialogue aimed to broaden students' understanding of the importance of sustainable food systems and their impact on achieving global sustainability objectives.

The Clean-Up Day

Haileybury Astana Eco-School, in partnership with the Akimat city administration, arranged a <u>Litter Picking Day</u> at Astana's Presidential Park. The primary goal of this event was to foster environmental consciousness and cleanliness within the Haileybury community.

This initiative sought to educate our students about critical environmental issues, instilling a more favourable and enthusiastic attitude towards addressing these concerns. For two hours dedicated to litter collection, our students not only contributed to improving the environment but also gained new insights while enjoying themselves. As a token of appreciation, each participant in this event received a symbolic wooden medal, recognizing them as eco-warriors.

The Sustainability Exhibition

Additionally, the school organized a <u>Sustainability Exhibition</u> in collaboration with the Creative Arts Department and Junior School teachers. The exhibition, held on April 19th, featured an interactive showcase addressing issues such as global warming, inequality, and pollution. Senior School pupils delivered an immersive performance, while Junior School pupils created artwork and banners.

Recognizing the importance of sustainable transportation, IBS has initiated a pilot project for a school bus service with two routes catering to specific areas of the city. The success of this pilot programme is closely monitored to determine its potential for future expansion. The aim is to provide safe and reliable transportation options for pupils, intending to increase the number of bus routes in the future.

UNESCO Club

In 2021, students of the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme at Haileybury Astana initiated the establishment of a <u>UNESCO Club</u>. Recognizing the challenges brought by the year 2020, the Sixth Form pupils felt the need to come together, seek hope, and explore what they could accomplish collectively.

The UNESCO Club provides an avenue for students to delve into their own cultures and share their knowledge with their peers. Within the framework of this project, students have the opportunity to engage in activities that promote environmental stewardship and offer assistance to those in need.

Participating in charity, creative, and educational events, students are able to enhance their communication skills, discover leadership qualities within themselves, and learn how to conscientiously contribute to society. The UNESCO Club serves as a platform where pupils can grow personally and make a positive impact on their school and the broader community.

Human Rights Assembly

As an international IB World School, it is imperative to foster a strong sense of community and promote tolerance and respect among students, as well as academic and administrative staff members. Throughout the academic year, Haileybury Astana conducts assemblies for Senior School pupils with a focus on raising awareness about human rights and addressing ethical topics.

In addition to the fundraising event, Haileybury Astana also extends access to its facilities to young members of the organization. This allows them to partake in various sports events, including swimming tournaments and other activities. By providing these opportunities, Haileybury Astana aims to showcase the numerous benefits of participating in physical activities for children with special needs while fostering inclusivity and support within the school community.

Animal shelters

The pupils were invited to wear blue to school to raise awareness of our commitment to stop bullying. Teachers interacted with the theme of the week in their lessons, while pupils were invited to participate in the Anti-Bullying Week Competition 2022 and create a piece of work to show what reaching out means to them.

This week is full of activities and events to support the Anti-Bullying campaign. Our school has no tolerance for bullying. We are committed to supporting our student's mental health and well-being so that they can achieve their full potential to be successful and enjoy their time at school. As an essential part of the week, we held an Odd Socks and Crazy Hair Parade for the Whole School community.

The main message of this day was to show that we may be different, but everyone is equal.

On that day, pupils walked around the school with the bricks they designed with slogans regarding the Anti-Bullying Week campaign. All collected bricks were built as a wall, which symbolised our unity against bullying.

The Launch of the Tootoot app

At Haileybury Astana, the safety and well-being of every child are the highest priority. As part of our ongoing mission to improve pupil well-being, the school introduced the <u>Tootoot</u> <u>app</u>.

Toot Toot is a global app through which pupils can report anything from bullying to mental health issues in complete confidence.

Peer Education

The <u>Peer Education Project</u> (PEP) is a secondary school mental health programme, available to all UK and International British schools. In Kazakhstan, Haileybury Astana is the first school to implement the project in the education system.

At Haileybury Astana, we started the project last year in November 2022, and since then we have trained teachers to lead peer education sessions. As part of the project, Senior School students held peer-to-peer sessions where other students were free to ask for support.

Students in Years 10 and 12 volunteered to become Peer Educators. They were trained in small groups and now teach five lessons related to Mental Health challenges to their peers in Years 7 and 8 during tutoring sessions.

Dress to Express Day

We also ran Mental Health Awareness Week, focusing on anxiety and effective coping strategies. Throughout that week, the school had various activities, lessons, and assemblies. The Junior School pupils danced at the discos, while Senior School pupils had the opportunity to take part in lunchtime activities such as art therapy and karaoke.

The celebration of the <u>Dress to Express Day</u> encouraged pupils and staff to show their individuality through outfits. It was the final week dedicated to Mental Health Awareness in the 2022 - 2023 academic year.

FOBISIA Membership

On June 20th, 2023, Haileybury Astana officially became a member of the <u>Federation of British</u> International Schools in Asia (FOBISIA).

From May 23 to 24, the school hosted representatives from FOBISIA, who conducted a rigorous accreditation process. During their visit, our guests observed our strategic plans, facilities, and academic performances. We are thrilled to share that our school received excellent feedback, making us the second school in Kazakhstan to successfully join the Federation.


